REJUVENATING YUSOF ISHAK HOUSE: BRIGHTER, HEALTHIER, AND ENERGY SAVING

Get ready for the much-anticipated reopening of Yusof Ishak House (YIH) in August 2025! This iconic 1970s landmark will soon reopen. Designed as the next Net Zero Energy (NZE) building on campus, YIH will house colleagues from OSA, CFG, GRO and students from NUSSU, GSS and other student groups.

The transformation of YIH was made possible through the efforts of many teams. The Project Management team, with Associate Professor Erik G. L'Heureux, Department of Architecture, redesigned the building to improve air flow, increase daylight, and create naturally ventilated spaces. Meanwhile, the Sustainability Strategy Unit ensures this Net Zero Energy building runs efficiently and produces as much renewable energy on-site as possible. The Campus Services team has also brought in new dining outlets offering healthier food choices and opened up more rooms and facilities for booking, enhancing the vibrancy of the new building.



Throughout this process, the Campus Planning and Management team, alongside the Space Allocation & Capital Evaluation committee, ensured that YIH's 1970s architectural charm was preserved, while adapting the space for modern needs.

Even more teams are pitching in with YIH transiting from design to operations, including Campus Asset Management teams (Asset Enhancement and Environmental Enhancement), Campus Emergency and Security, and the NUS IT teams, among others.
