With the official launch of Valour House just around the corner, over 100 NUS students and staff recently got an exclusive first taste of what's to come during a 2-day Trial Stay held from 20-21 June. In this special preview staff and students of NUS not only had the opportunity to check out the facilities but also experienced the atmosphere of Valour House firsthand.

From racetrack-inspired corridor designs to sky lounges with fitness zones and seamless access to the University Sports Centre, Valour House is designed for those who live and breathe active lifestyles. Even the building's ecoconscious features, like energy-efficient lighting, water-saving fixtures, and recycling points, support both human and environmental wellbeing.

"Valour House brings to life our vision of a living space that inspires students to be active in body, connected in community, and mindful of their impact on the environment," shared Dr Ivan Low, Master for Valour House.

The journey from blueprint to build was a complex one, requiring not just vision but teamwork across disciplines. From creating an energy-efficient structure to curating the student experience down to the last detail, Valour House represents what's possible when the NUS community comes together with purpose.

The Trial Stay gave us the chance to stress test facilities and make final refinements. As the Housing Services team from Valour House shared — we remain committed to creating a welcoming, inclusive environment where both students and staff feel at home.

As the countdown continues to its official opening, Valour House is already setting the tone for a bold new chapter in student living—active, connected, and sustainable.
